With this in mind, the recommendations and strategies have been prepared in the spirit of promoting greater understanding of everyones roles in making Grand City a better place to life and in effect, to ensure that future decisions regarding the development

character of the city meet both resident and city officials expectations.

Development Criteria

A major component of an ongoing program to enhance the city's form and character is the creation of development criteria? that can be used to assist residents and city official's in critiquing development proposals. The development industry can also use the criteria as an indication of what is expected them when they engage in activities? which alter the form and character of the city.

Each proposed development must be compatible with the iscorresponding community and neighborhood of which the development will be a part. There can be no mandbook for urban design frather, the criteria must be tailored for each specific area of the city. Future community and neighborhood plans will refine these issues farther, and define the scope and applicability of the criteria for a particular neighborhood or district.
